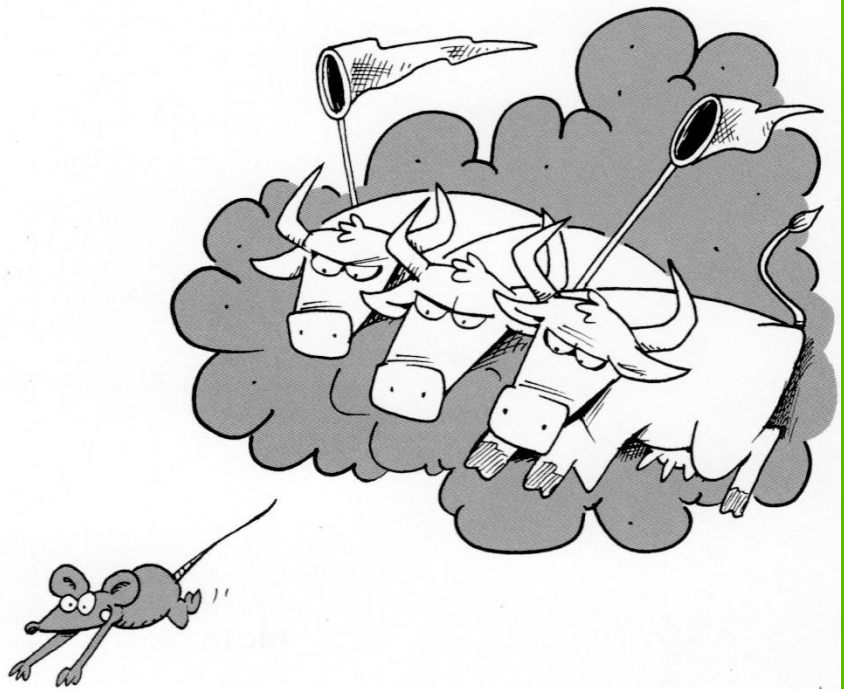


SILLY SENTENCES
